REPORT OF THE BOARD CHAIR & CEO

For almost three years, Hôpital Notre-Dame Hospital (HNDH), its staff and doctors have been working in difficult conditions. Once financially healthy, HNDH is now in a deficit situation that will require prioritization of expenditures in the coming year and will result in the largest projected deficit in our institution's history.



Our hospital is working very hard to stretch resources in response to chronic underfunding. All of the additional expenses related to managing Covid-19 that were covered by Ministry funding until last summer are now part of our operating costs. The cost of hiring staffing agency workers, increased costs for food, medicine, materials and energy due to inflation and Ontario's wage freeze legislation for healthcare workers are undermining our system's performance and our capacity to serve the growing number of orphaned patients, as in our hospitalist program.

HNDH does not expect the situation to improve in the short term. Meanwhile, the privatization of healthcare services is a cause for concern. In our hospital, these pressures have led to the hiring of 10 to 13 staffing agency workers for whom the hospital pays wages, travel and lodging. The demand for healthcare services is rising in our area due to the aging population. The shortage of family doctors, the lack of nursing and support staff in Hearst and the surrounding area and the use of agency workers to maintain quality care greatly increase our costs. In addition, the lack of resources is a constant concern in order to carry out our plans to improve our infrastructure systems, technology systems and our green shift.

Patients are more often ill-disposed and following a number of violent incidents, we have had to reconfigure our procedures and redesign our facilities to ensure the safety of healthcare workers.

All these constraints require new solutions. HNDH is turning to the private sector for funds. As for medical recruiting, the favoured solution is community engagement. Reducing the uncertainty of provincial funding is vital to ensuring the future of our hospital and, indeed, the entire healthcare system in Ontario.

Today, we are inviting the population to respond to the pressures their area hospital and the healthcare system are facing. You can support us in the following ways.

- -Be informed about the challenges our healthcare system is facing.
- -Show understanding and tolerance for healthcare workers who are at the breaking point.
- -Become a volunteer at the hospital as a board member, an ombudsperson or patient representative, or a support worker.
- -Encourage young people to consider careers in healthcare to address our human resource needs.
- -Lobby our provincial and federal members of Parliament.
- -Take part in our community's efforts to recruit doctors and nurses.
- -Donate generously to the activities of the hospital's Auxiliary and the HNDH Foundation.

Your hospital and the healthcare system need your support in many ways.

We would like to end by thanking, on our behalf and the Board of Directors, all those who are dedicated to the HNDH's mission of providing excellent care close to home. The dedication of our nursing staff, support staff and administrative team is remarkable and is undoubtedly our greatest asset in meeting today's challenges.

REPORT FROM THE CHIEF OF MEDICAL STAFF

It is my pleasure to present the annual report of the Chief of Medical Staff for Notre-Dame Hospital. Despite the ongoing challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and the severe shortage of local physicians, our hospital has continued to provide excellent care to our patients. The medical staff has remained dedicated to ensuring the highest quality of care and improving patient outcomes and satisfaction.



Some of the key accomplishments of the medical staff over the past year include:

- Maintaining the operation of our emergency department (ED) despite physician shortages and occasional
 difficulties in finding locums. This achievement is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our medical
 staff and locums.
- Continuing the successful hospitalist program with the extraordinary work of our local physicians, with the
 assistance of locums. The hospitalist program has resulted in improved patient outcomes, reduced length of
 stay, and better management of patient flow through our hospital, which has been critical during the
 pandemic.
- Contributing to medical education by hosting a 3rd-year medical student and a family medicine resident. Our commitment to medical education reflects our dedication to the future of healthcare.
- Initiating a recruitment strategy to address our physician shortage. Our recruitment coordinator has been working tirelessly to secure enough locums to cover the ED and hospitalist program. Moreover, we have successfully recruited two new physicians who are expected to begin practicing in the fall of 2023.

Unfortunately, our greatest challenge remains the severe shortage of physicians. Dr. Nicole Ranger has decided to close her practice this year and return to Sudbury. We wish her all the best in her future endeavors.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all members of the medical staff for their dedication and hard work over the past year. Your commitment to our patients and to our hospital is greatly appreciated, and I look forward to continuing to work together to provide the best possible care to our community.

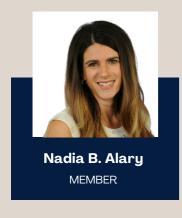
